Proposition No. 1

Shall Ordinance 09-1636 of the City of Ketchikan become effective, and the City Charter amended by adding a new Section 8-5 to Article 8 PUBLIC UTILITIES AND ENTERPRISES to read as follows:

Section 8-5. Sale of telecommunications division authorized. The City of Ketchikan, Alaska shall have the power and authority to sell the telecommunications division of Ketchikan Public Utilities and related property, rights and interests, at a price that equals or exceeds the fair market value, as determined by Falkenberg Capital Corporation and approved by the City Council.

Note: A "Yes" vote on Proposition No. 1 is a vote in favor of the City of Ketchikan, upon the approval of the City Council, selling the telecommunications division of Ketchikan Public Utilities at a price that equals or exceeds the fair market value as determined by Falkenberg Capital Corporation

A "No" vote on Proposition No. 1 is a vote against the City of Ketchikan selling the telecommunications division of Ketchikan Public Utilities.

Proposition No. 2

Shall the City Charter be amended by adding a new Section 8-6 to Article 8 PUBLIC UTILITIES AND ENTERPRISES to read as follows:

Section 8-6. Utility Rate Stabilization Fund. In the event that the sale of the telecommunications division of Ketchikan Public Utilities and related property, rights and interests is approved by the voters, the net proceeds of the sale shall be placed in a separate fund called the Utility Rate Stabilization Fund. The principal of the Fund may be expended only for public electric or water utility purposes. The Council shall, by ordinance, provide for the investment of the principal, the payment of principal expended for utility purposes, and the expenditures for utility purposes of income from the investment of the principal.
