**PUBLIC HEARING ON ORDINANCE NO. 10-1659 – AMENDING
THE KETCHIKAN MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 11.12 –

Mayor Williams called the public hearing on Ordinance No. 10-1659 to order at 7:02 p.m. and requested public testimony.

Mayor Williams said there was a memorandum laid on the table reporting on lake levels as of July 14, 2010.

PERSONS TO BE HEARD

Louis Hook, representing Coastal Footprint, said they are sailing a small sailboat down the West coast and doing beach cleanups. He said they started in Juneau and Haines, have gone to Glacier Bay, Sitka and now Ketchikan. He reported on the debris they have gathered in Ketchikan and Misty Fjords. He hoped the City would be willing to forego their harbor fees while they are in town, and he asked if the Council had any other areas they might want cleaned.

Councilmember Kj Harris suggested the Council waive all their harbor fees. Mayor Williams asked if there were any objections, and none were heard. In response to Councilmember Shay, Mr. Hook cited the types of the debris they are picking up.

NEW BUSINESS

Presentation of Goals and Work Plan/Schedule for Contract No. 10-08, Comprehensive Storm Drainage Study – Tetra Tech Alaska, LLC

Senior Project Engineer Brakke introduced James Templeton of Tetra Tech. Mr. Templeton explained Ketchikan needs a storm drainage study because of the amount of rain received each year, there are some very steep and erodable soils and the consequences of poor or inappropriate drainage are fairly severe. He noted Mr. Brakke has started the process by identifying existing drainage problems, counting up 114 existing issues, which is quite a lot for a small city. He stated some of these are fairly significant projects that will be expensive and need to be addressed fairly soon.

Mr. Templeton continued he has examined some of the problems and has found the pipe network is primarily built from corrugated steel pipe that is starting to reach the end of its serviceable life of approximately 25 years. He explained some of them are located under inappropriate fill and poor compaction that is leading to the pipe being squashed. He said as they come down the hill they go from pipe section to open channel back to pipe section, and the inlets are prone to plugging and clogging. He pointed out some of the drain systems are located on private property and the City doesn't have easements for maintenance or access. He said some of the opening channels or pipes are located close to existing buildings and for some, buildings are built right on top of them.

He said Ketchikan fortunately doesn't face a lot of state or federal regulations regarding the stormwater infrastructure, so the results of the plan can be tailored to the City's priorities, values and budget. He stated they are trying to develop a system of sensible development, and in the long run he felt it would be cost effective, protect private and public property and promote public safety. He explained the second major portion is to identify and prioritize the existing problems so the City can schedule for the replacement and construction, as well as plan to pay for them.

Mr. Templeton elaborated by stating the first part to manage and maintain a stormwater system is to know what you have: open channels and where they are, what kind of pipes you have and how deep are they, what materials and conditions exist. He said they are trying to produce a modern information system that will assist City staff in pulling up maintenance records, construction reports, videos, and drawing profiles of the pipes so they can maintain the system on a day-to-day level. He went on to explain the second part, a CIP program and the development of draft ordinances. He noted they will also look at how to pay for the projects. He briefly explained the schedule, stating they hoped to have the whole project done by October of this year. Mr. Templeton answered questions from the Council.

Presentation of the Public Education Program Associated with Conversion from Sodium Hypochlorite Disinfection to Chloramine Disinfection – CH2M Hill

Floyd Damron of CH2M Hill provided an overview of the KPU water treatment project, discussing Safe Drinking Water Act regulations, the UV Disinfection Facility Project, and the timelines under which KPU is required to comply. He congratulated the Council for the foresight in moving forward with the project to meet compliance with the regulations. He said the question has become how all the water systems in America reduce the amount of chlorine and disinfectants that are put in the water, which has saved millions of lives, and stop the byproducts that result.

Mr. Damron stated because Ketchikan has remained an infiltration-avoidance community, KPU has elected to add ammonia to the water to remove the byproducts. He noted the facility is essentially complete and perhaps within 30 days will be in operation. In response to Councilmember Kj Harris, Mr. Damron said it will not affect the taste of the water. He displayed a diagram showing the flow of water from the lake to end user distribution.

Colleen Soberay provided a fact sheet related to public education regarding the new facility. She outlined several aspects contained on the fact sheet: why drinking water is disinfected, the advantages of using chloramines, the safety aspect of chloramines, and sensitive user groups. She explained the contacts she has made regarding dialysis patients, and the information that should be made available to aquarium and terrarium users. She further discussed how the new system works in conjunction with cruise ships.

Ms. Soberay said there will be a public information meeting and open house on July 21, 2010 at the Ted Ferry Civic Center from 6:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. She answered questions from the Council.

The Council took a short break at 8:00 p.m. and reconvened at 8:05 p.m.

Award of Contract No. 10-18 and Budget Transfer – 2010 Bituminous Pavement Overlay Project, Colaska, Inc., d/b/a Secon

Moved by Shay, seconded by Jason Harris the City Council accept the bid of Colaska Inc., d/b/a Secon in the amount of \$643,325 for Contract No. 10-18, 2010 Bituminous Pavement Overlay Project; establish a ten percent contingency in the amount of \$64,332.50, bringing the total project cost to \$707,657.50; authorize a budget transfer of \$550,000 from the Streets Division's 2010 Chip Seal Capital Account to the Asphalt Overlay Capital Account; approve funding in the amount of \$707,657.50 from the 2010 Streets and Cemetery Divisions' 2010 Asphalt and Driveway Overlays Capital Accounts; and direct the city manager to execute the contract documents on behalf of the City Council.

Public Works Director Allen answered questions from the Council.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

**Schedule of General Government and KPU Appropriated
Reserves Through the City Council Meeting of July 1,
2010**

Manager Amylon provided the Council a schedule of the current balance of Appropriated Reserves of the various funds of General Government and KPU through the City Council meeting of July 1, 2010.

Public Works Department Project Status Report – June 2010

Manager Amylon included a copy of the Public Works Department Project Status Report for the month of June 2010.

Contract No. 09-30 Update – Tongass Avenue Utilities Replacement Phase II, S&S General Contractors & Equipment Rentals, Inc.

Manager Amylon provided a report from the Engineering Division summarizing the project activities through July 7, 2010 for Contract No. 09-30, Tongass Avenue Utilities Replacement Phase II.

Transport of David Rubin’s Bronze Casting of Seven Historical Figures to the Port of Ketchikan

Manager Amylon reported the events that took place to transport David Rubin’s bronze casting of seven historical figures from the Robertson Building to its current location on the Port of Ketchikan. He expressed appreciation to the individuals for their efforts in accomplishing this event.

Councilmember Shay listed the City’s staff who participated in the move, and thanked them for their efforts.

Renewal of the City’s Blue Cross-VSP Health Insurance Plan for Fiscal Year 2010-11

Manager Amylon provided a memorandum from Finance Director Newell outlining the situation with the City’s health insurance premiums. Mr. Newell reported the rate increase for this year is 19 percent, of which the City picks up the first five percent and splits the difference equally with the employees.

Report of Federal Lobbyist

Manager Amylon included the July 8, 2010 report of the City’s federal lobbyist.

2010 Sales Tax Update

Manager Amylon conveyed a memorandum from Finance Director Newell regarding sales tax collections for the first and second quarters of 2010. Mr. Newell pointed out that while sales tax receipts are currently up 2.86% compared to 2009, it is too early to draw any meaningful conclusions based on collections to date.

August 24, 2010 Special Election

Manager Amylon reminded the August 24, 2010 special election relative to a library site was coming up. He noted he shared a draft mock-up of what we’d like to put on the

City's website relative to the election, stating it is a factual, objective accounting of how we've reached this point. He requested direction as to a formal recommendation relative to the ballot propositions. Councilmember Coose said if we put a proposition on the ballot, we need to support it. Mayor Williams sought consensus from the rest of the Council to support the Council's Proposition No. 1, and the majority of the Council felt this was appropriate.

Rural Development Application – Ketchikan General Hospital

Manager Amylon said based on conversations he has had with federal lobbyist Steve Silver relative to the appropriations process, it was advised that he and representatives from PeaceHealth go back to Washington DC to meet with the delegation and members of the Forest Service to talk about the rural development application. He said he would be leaving the week after next for that purpose and Councilmember West will also be going.

K.P.U. MANAGER'S REPORT

Project Status Reports of the KPU Operating Divisions – June 2010

Manager Amylon transmitted the project status reports of the KPU operating divisions for the month of June 2010.

In response to Councilmember West, Electric Division Manager Kline said there are a couple of parallel paths going on. He reported they had a meeting with SEAPA about a week ago, when they came up with a couple of temporary alternatives to make sure KPU is getting the data and control if things happen. He continued this evening they were told by SEAPA that L&S is getting ready to do the acceptance testing for the SCADA control, which is a total change of direction from what they heard at the SEAPA Board meeting. He reported they were told L&S was out of the picture for non-performance issues. He expressed KPU is not comfortable where this is heading. Councilmember Coose urged the KPU Advisory Board to ask Mr. Carlson to make a presentation to them.

Mr. Kline also reported SEAPA's new operations manager has started, and he has a good amount of operations experience. He noted in the past couple of weeks he has been very much changing the dynamics, and KPU is finding him to be a positive communication channel.

Southeast Alaska Power Agency (SEAPA) Wholesale Power Rate for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2011

Manager Amylon provided a report from Electric Division Manager Kline, which informed that the Southeast Alaska Power Agency approved a wholesale power rate of \$0.068 per kilowatt-hour for its Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2011. He noted this

maintains the wholesale power rate at the same level for the agency's fiscal year that ended June 30, 2010.

Mayor Williams said this rate was kept for a few years to build up the reserves, and now they are getting up there where they are in good shape. He felt since SEAPA is in good financial shape and once the reserves reach the point where everyone is comfortable, they should be able to reduce the rate so everyone can experience some financial benefits.

Interim Alternative to Ketchikan Hydroelectric Project Transformer Replacement

Manager Amylon included a report alerting the Council that, according to Electrical Systems Engineer Donato, the replacement of the transformer at the Ketchikan Hydroelectric Project will likely be under-funded. The report stated staff's intent to undertake an interim solution that involves the refurbishment of the transformer. He noted this should add significant service life to the transformer.

Potential Sale of the Telecommunications Division

Manager Amylon reported staff is at the due diligence stage of the process, where staff is getting inquiries from potential companies that have indicated an interest in taking a look at KPU. He stated the inquiries are quite substantial and will be consuming a lot of staff time over the next couple of weeks. He requested the Council's indulgence over the next couple of weeks as they are working on the process.

Clerk Suiter said she would be out of town for a couple of weeks.

MAYOR AND COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilmember Shay said his granddaughter who had the tumor removed had a setback recently, but she was now doing better.

Councilmember West said she heard from a constituent that the crossing guards no longer have whistles, and the pedestrians seems to have more wanderlust than usual. She questioned whether there was a reason why they don't have whistles anymore, and Manager Amylon said he would check with the Port and Harbors director. She said she also heard from a constituent near the Lutheran Church where some construction is occurring, and the contractor has not adhered to the stop time of 11:00 p.m. She reported Public Works Director Allen has been very helpful in trying to resolve the issue, and the

contractor is now aware of the construction stop time. She asked if there was interest in changing the construction stop time to 10:00 p.m., and Mayor Williams asked staff to draft an ordinance.

Councilmember Jason Harris said there was some previous discussion about lighting the new artwork on the dock, and Manager Amylon said one light is up already, but the Port and Harbors director will talk to KPU about the angling of the light.

Councilmember Sivertsen said he will be out of town for the special meeting on July 22nd attending the major league baseball tournament.

Mayor Williams said the manager would like to discuss his contract with the mayor and one councilmember, and he requested volunteers, and Councilmember West offered to assist. He expressed concern about issues with independent tour operators on the dock, and there was some vandalism. He stated George Lybrand felt some of the issues on the projects he is working on are not all his fault.
